The observed outcome of critical thinking and decision-making. It is an iterative process that uses nursing knowledge to observe and assess presenting situations, identify a prioritized client concern, and generate the best possible evidence-based solution in order to deliver safe client care.		
Recognize Cues:	BELOW THE PASSING STANDARD	
Identify relevant and important information from different sources (e.g., medical history, vital signs).		
Analyze Cues:	BELOW THE PASSING STANDARD	
Organizing and linking the recognized cues to the client's clinical presentation.		
Prioritize Hypotheses:	BELOW THE PASSING STANDARD	
Evaluating and ranking hypotheses according to priority (urgency, likelihood, risk, difficulty, time, etc.).		
Generate Solutions:	BELOW THE PASSING STANDARD	
Identifying expected outcomes and using hypotheses to define a set of interventions for the expected outcomes.
