Taxi

Travelers should only use taxi service when van service or rideshare is not available or if the cost of sharing a cab with another attendee is comparable to the shuttle fare. Taxicab service at the Domestic Terminal is located in the Ground Transportation Center/West Curb, immediately outside and between the W-1 and W-2 doors. Expect to spend \$30–\$40 for a one-way trip and possibly more if traveling early in the morning or late in the evening.

Rideshare

Rideshare (Uber/Lyft) pickups occur in the North Economy lot. Passengers will proceed through North baggage claim for access to the lower-level escalators located between doors N2 and N3.
