3.	Legislative Update	<ul> <li>R. Fotsch provided the legislative update.</li> <li>Several bills are still pending.</li> <li>Most legislatures have adjourned.</li> <li>VT: Has passed out of House</li> </ul>	

		<ul> <li>and is now in the Senate. Legislature will return in August.</li> <li>PA: Passed the Senate unanimously and bill is now in the House. Legislature in recess until Sept.</li> <li>MI: No status change. Bill passed out of first chamber. Needs final approval in Senate. Unions and democrats are not supportive. Legislature is on a break.</li> <li>MA: NLC is attached to a telehealth bill currently being debated. The bill may move before the legislature breaks for summer.</li> <li>Guam: The bill is pending and a hearing has not been scheduled.</li> <li>Virgin Islands: The BON requested a copy of the NLC model legislation for the governor's office.</li> </ul>	
4.	Equal Access to Care Act and Related Legal Memo	Bill introduced in the Senate by Sen Cruz. Bill allows providers to provide services in a state through telehealth to persons in another state whose practice is authorized simply by virtue of having a license in one state. Conflicts with NLC because it provides that the laws of state where practitioner resides apply. The bill only applies to situations arising under COVID and limits itself to related emergency declarations. It does not require practitioners to comply with NLC. E. Vice said prospects for the bill's success are not positive.	J. Ridenour moved to distribute the memo to Commissioners and J. Baker seconded. The motion passed.
5.	Informational Document Related to Reciprocal Actions	B. Thompson May presented the updated informational document from the NLC Rules Committee with legal references.	J. Ridenour moved to adopt the primer as written, disseminate to Commissioners and post to the public side of the NLC website and S. Pfenning seconded. The motion

			passed.
