

- Advise the BOD on matters related to the NCLEX examination process, including examination item development, security, administration and quality assurance to ensure consistency with the nursing regulatory body's need for examinations
- Develop NCLEX® prototype items that use technology enhanced item types focused on measuring clinical decision making/judgment



FY21 Accomplishments

Updated NCLEX-RN® and NCLEX-PN® test design, effective Oct. 1, 2020

- Maintained COVID modifications to operational exam structure
- Reintroduced NCLEX-RN and NCLEX-PN pretest sections
- Transitioned exam tutorial to online
- Resumed NCLEX-RN Special Research Section
- Launched NCLEX-PN Special Research Section
- Set exam length at 5 hours

Introduction of Partial Credit Scoring

- NCLEX today A candidate response to an item is either correct or incorrect—i.e., dichotomous scoring
 - Points possible: 0 or 1
- NGN Clinical Judgment items A candidate response may be partially correct and receive partial credit—i.e., polytomous scoring
 - Points possible: 0, 1, 2, 3, etc.
- Three ways to assign partial credit on NGN

Proposed Scoring Methods

Plus-Minus (+/-) scoring

- Add one point for each correct response element
- Subtract one point for each incorrect response element
- If result is negative assign score of 0
- Used when candidates can select any number of options

One-Zero (1/0) scoring

- Add one point for each correct response element
- Do not subtract points for incorrect response elements
- Used when candidates must "select N" options

Rationale scoring

- One point for each correct grouping of response elements
- Used when elements of response are linked (e.g., "The nurse should question the order for because of the client's _____.)

Proposed Scoring

- More precise measurement
- Appropriate for items assessing range and depth of knowledge
- May be considered more fair
